Our role as Administrators of DOI Infrastructure enables us create unlimited repositories using different technologies and frameworks and assigning independent DOI prefixes.

By creating Peer Review Systems for Journals with Open Journal Systems, we have the capacity to assign independent DOI prefixes that will enable the Journals to operate with a greater measure of success.

A journal having its independent prefix (such as a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) prefix offers several benefits for the journal, its authors, and the research community. Here are some key advantages:

- 3. Theses and Dissertation from Undergraduate and Postgraduate students can be given visibility.

The Requirements

We only have two requirements.:

- 1. Annual Membership at Category A (Premium) at \$200.
- 2. Upfront purchase of DOI Units at \$1 per DOI. Renewal of Membership will carry forward remaining DOI Units to the next year. The Units will remain and serve the Journal until due for renewal.
